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1. Introduction

The MediTec Network aims to open a wide range of opportunities:


- 1. To facilitate exchange of good practices between the members through the MediTec portal and twinning procedures in order to promote transfer of knowledge between its members;

2. Results


2.1 Student Pre-Course Questionnaire

When people were asked about their feedback on the courses they have taken and their understanding and if it met their expectations, the answers were as follow:

• The level of the students included in this questionnaire, in equal percentage (30%) students of 2nd and 3rd year, (20%) of 4th year, in addition to (10%) from 5th and 6th year.




• Secondly, for the gender of the surveyed people more than the half were males (70%) and (30%) were females as shown in the figure below.






• As shown in figure 3, the percentage of students in each course, (20%) in AI in health care, (40%) in MediTec, (20%) in Medicine and (20%) in anatomy.





• Regarding to their knowledge in the course, (10%) their opinion was excellent, half of the students (50%) who participate in the survey are satisfied and said it's very good, (30%) said it's good, (10%) was poor for them (Figure 4).




Figure 5: Why did you choose this course?




Figure 6: The expected benefits of taking this course can be evaluated as which of the followings?




Figure 7: Have you had any practical experience in the area of this course?

• (20%) of the surveyed people had practical experience in the area of this course, in contrast (80%) don't (Figure 7).





Figure 8: How much do you believe that the theoretical knowledge you gain through this course is applicable?

• As shown in figure 8, (90%) strongly believe it is applicable in the industry and (10%) believe it is only applicable if some criteria are met and under some circumstances.

2.2 Student Post-Course Questionnaire

When people were asked about their feedback on the courses they have taken and their understanding and if it met their expectations. Also, they asked about the lecturers who introduced this course and their responses for both sections were as follow:

• Firstly, for the gender of the surveyed people more than the half were males (64.1%) and (35.9%) were females as shown in the figure below.



• As shown in figure 2, for the question if they gained knowledge most of the surveyed people (71.4%) answer that they fully applies the knowledge they gained, (20.7%) does rather apply , (4.3%) does rather not apply and (3.6%) does not apply at all.





Figure 10: I've gained new knowledge






• For 140 responses on this question, (53.6%) the course content meet their expectations, where (33.6%) does rather apply, (3.6%) does rather not apply, (8.6%) does not apply at all and (0.7%) refers to 1 person don't know (Figure 4).





Interest is a powerful motivational process that energizes learning, guides academic and career trajectories, and is essential to academic success. In our survey (55.7%) their interest in the issues dealt with was enhanced while (30%) does rather apply, (4.3%) does rather not apply, (7.9%) does not apply at all and (2.1%) don't know (Figure 5).

 Teaching students to apply knowledge and skills to benefit others or serve the public good and to use these skills in their future careers is one exceptionally high impact method to foster these capabilities across the disciplines, a high percentage of the surveyed people (70.9%) believe that they learn skills and knowledge that will be useful for their careers in the future, (18.4%) does rather apply that the skills and knowledge will be useful, (2.8%) does rather not apply, (5.7%) does not apply at all and (2.1%) don't know (Figure 6).




Figure 14: Knowledge and skills were taught will be useful for my career in the future




Figure 15: I would like to participate at other/more teaching courses dealing with this topic





Figure 16: I would recommend this course to my fellow students





Figure 18: The teacher seemed to be proficient in the field tackled by the course





Figure 20: The content was well and logically structured and a red thread was visible




Figure 22: The scope and the degree of difficulty of the course contents are appropriate




Figure 23: The teaching materials are well elaborated and useful for me




Figure 24: Please grade the course in general – which mark would you give?
